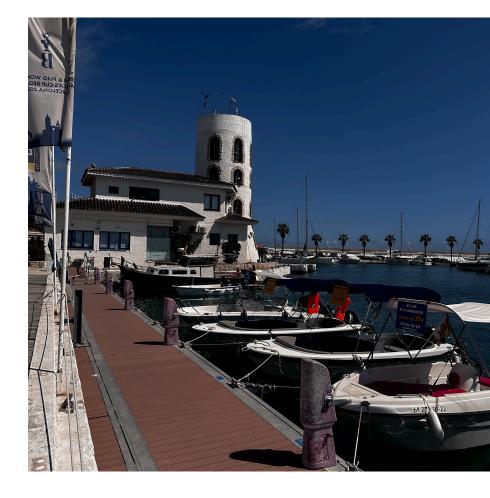
This guide has been created to help you understand the process and avoid surprises along the way. Keep it with you during your search and refer to it often — it will make your renting journey easier, faster, and less stressful.

# Getting Started

It is always better to begin your search at least one to two months before your desired move-in date. While the Catalan rental market moves quickly and many listings are taken within days, allowing yourself extra time means you will not feel pressured into making the wrong decision. With some flexibility, you can explore neighborhoods at different times of day, compare options, and prepare the documents most landlords will ask for.

Sant Cugat offers a variety of lifestyles: the town center with its restaurants and shops, family-oriented residential zones like Valldoreix and Mirasol, and hillside areas with larger homes and views. Think about how you want to live day-to-day: do you need fast train access to Barcelona, outdoor space for children, or proximity to international schools? The clearer your vision, the easier it will be to identify the right home.

## Budget & Requirements

Most landlords in Catalonia expect tenants to show stable income of at least two to three times the monthly rent. In addition to the first month's rent, tenants are legally required to provide a onemonth security deposit, known as the fianza, which is registered with the housing authority INCASÒL. In practice, many landlords request additional guarantees, often two to three extra months of rent, held either as a deposit or as a bank guarantee (aval bancario).

At the moment of signing, you should also be prepared for agency fees, which are typically ten percent of the annual rent plus VAT, unless you are renting directly from an owner. Other costs such as moving services, liability insurance, or setting up utilities should also be factored into your budget.

Anastasia will provide a complete breakdown of expected costs before you apply, so there are no surprises, and will negotiate terms with the landlord on your behalf.



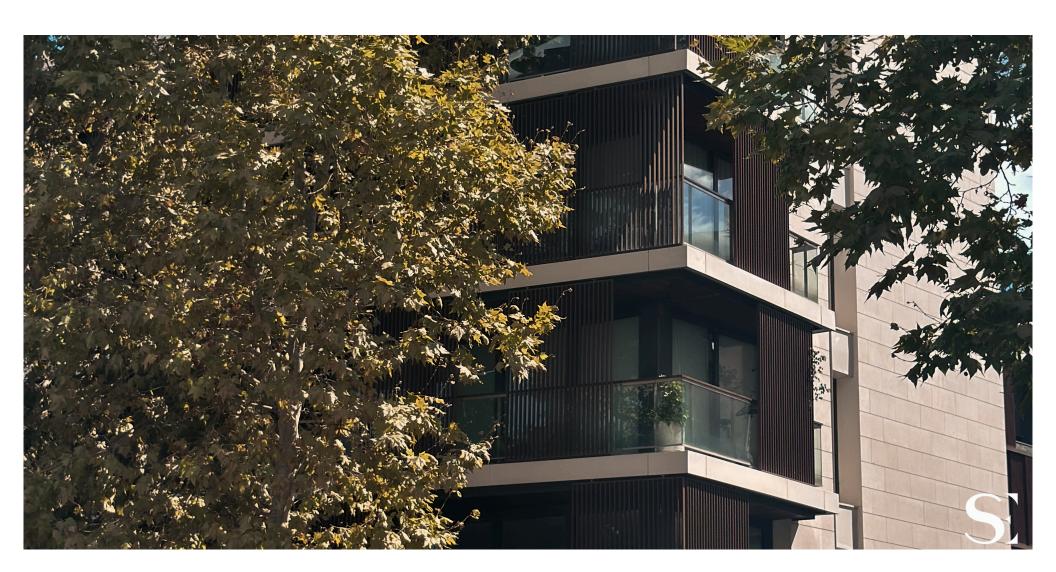


#### Documents

Landlords and agencies will want to see proof that you can meet rental obligations. For employees, this means a copy of your work contract, recent pay slips, and sometimes your tax declaration. Self-employed tenants are usually asked for bank statements and proof of ongoing professional activity.

Foreign residents without Spanish income history may be asked to provide stronger guarantees, such as paying several months in advance or securing a bank guarantee. Having your documents ready in advance gives you an advantage in a fast-moving market.

Anastasia can advise you on which documents will carry the most weight with local landlords and help you prepare a strong rental application.

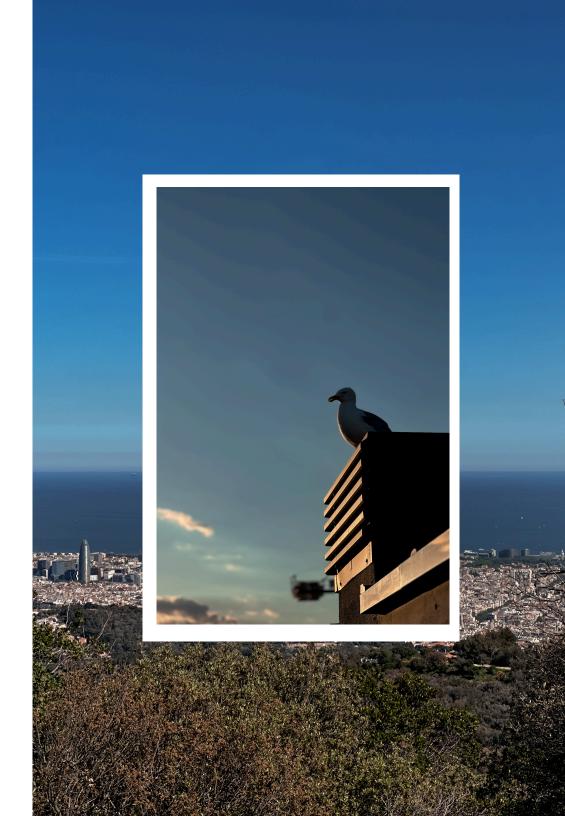


### The Renting Journey

The process usually begins with defining your criteria: the type of apartment, desired location, budget, and lease term. Once you begin visiting properties, be prepared to make decisions quickly — well-priced rentals in Sant Cugat often receive several offers within days. If you find the right place, your application will include the required documents and proof of funds.

Once the landlord accepts your application, you will proceed to contract signing. At this stage, you will pay the deposit, first month's rent, and any agency fees. It is important to review the contract carefully and ensure that all conditions — such as pet acceptance, maintenance responsibilities, and payment schedule — are clearly written. After signing, you will arrange utility contracts, register for empadronamiento at the local town hall, and prepare for your move-in day.

Anastasia will walk you through the entire process, review the lease with you, and connect you with reliable local service providers for utilities, internet, and insurance.



#### Practical Protes

Pets are welcome in many Sant Cugat homes, but not all landlords accept them, so always check in advance. Walking areas are plentiful: Collserola Park offers endless trails, and the town itself has dog-friendly zones, but having a pet will limit the number of available properties.

Insurance is another important detail. While not always required by law, most landlords will ask tenants to hold liability insurance (seguro de hogar), which protects both you and the property. It is also essential to have a Spanish bank account with an IBAN, as landlords and utility providers (water, electricity, gas) will only accept payments from local accounts. Finally, do not forget the empadronamiento: registering your new address with the town hall is essential for accessing healthcare, enrolling children in schools, and enjoying local services.

### Glossary of Terms

**Fianza** – The legal one-month security deposit, registered with INCASÒL.

**Aval Bancario** – A bank guarantee provided as additional landlord protection.

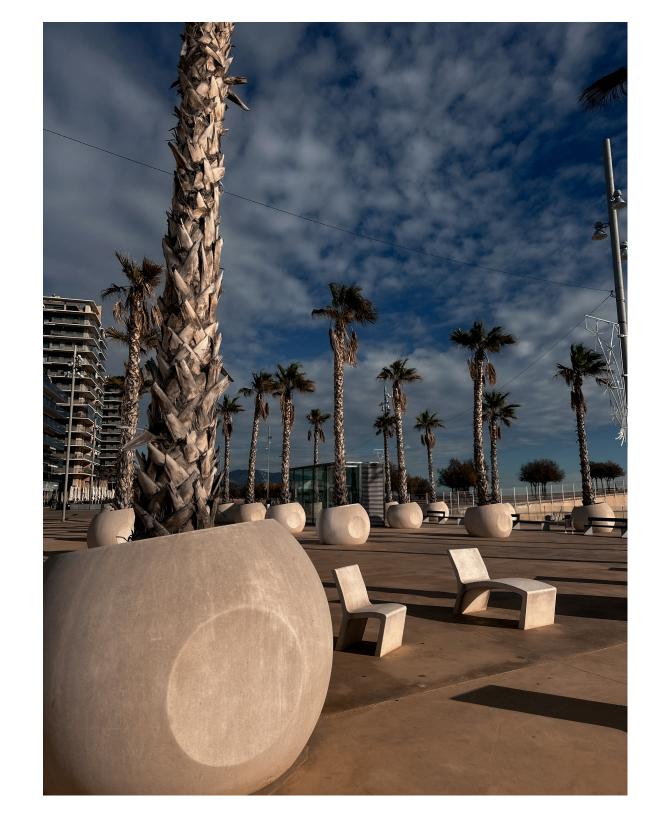
**Contrato de Arrendamiento** - Rental contract.

**Empadronamiento** - Municipal registration of your home address.

**Ático** - Top-floor apartment, often with a terrace.

**Bajo** - Ground-floor apartment, sometimes with a garden or patio.

**API** - Licensed real estate agent, legally accountable and insured.
